The video must not be a slideshow of images, it must a series of real-time video clips, or a timelapse video to demonstrate the member manufacturing the item. MEASUREMENTS: Display space – Half a trestle table to include the finished item and QR code. COSTINGS: Not to exceed £20 in total- costings to be displayed. Credibility of cost will be considered by the judge. TIME: 15 minutes to display the exhibit. NOTES: Item and video to be submitted to the YFC office, ready for judging prior to the Show/ day (4pm on Friday 17th May 2024). Members will be required to display their items on the day. No mobile phones to be used during competition. SCALE OF MARKS: Originality and choice of craft used – 15; Design – 15; Workmanship – 30; Presentation and appearance of finished item – 15; Content of Video – 15; Judges Questions – 10; TOTAL - 100

12. DANCING

A minimum of 4 minutes allowed. **TIME PENALTIES:** Up to 15 seconds overtime or undertime - 2 penalty marks; Up to 30 seconds overtime or undertime - 5 penalty marks; And a further 5 penalty marks will be deducted for every 15 seconds thereafter. **EQUIPMENT:** The YFC technician will be responsible for playing all mp3's. Competitors to submit their MP3 files to the YFC Office, either via Transfer or on a USB stick, by 4pm on Friday 17th May 2024. **SCALE OF MARKS:** TOTAL- 100

Minimum time allowed is 2 minutes. **TIME PENALTIES**: Up to 15 seconds overtime or undertime - 2 penalty marks; Up to 30 seconds overtime or undertime - 5 penalty marks; And a further 5 penalty marks will be deducted for every 15 seconds thereafter. **EQUIPMENT**: Members to supply the Mp3 files via Transfer or on USB stick which should include backing vocals only, to the YFC Office by **4pm on Friday 17**th May **2024** (Mp3's will be operated by the YFC technician). Microphones – Competitors will have the choice of

up to six handheld radio mics or headset radio mics. **SCALE OF MARKS:** Performance – 35; Vocal – 35; Costume – 10; Overall Effect – 20; **TOTAL – 100.**

NOTES**: A table and chairs will be provided – competitors can bring their own costumes, props etc. No set will be allowed. **PLEASE NOTE**: A draw will be one for the order of appearance. **TIME**: 30 minutes preparation time. 3 minutes will be allowed for the live news report. 2 minutes will be allowed for stage preparation prior to the live broadcast. **PENALTIES**: Up to 15 seconds overtime / undertime - 2 penalty marks; Up to 30 seconds overtime / undertime - 5 penalty marks; a further 5 penalty marks will be deducted for every 15 seconds thereafter. **SCALE OF MARKS**: Style and Presentation – 25; Content – 25: Interpretation of Brief – 15; Use of brief and press pack – 20; Teamwork – 15; **TOTAL - 100**

Members to supply the appropriate Mp3 files to the YFC Office by **4pm on Friday 24th May 2024** (USB \ Mp3's will be operated by the YFC technician). Competitors will have the choice of up to six hand held radio mics or headset radio mics. **SCALE OF MARKS**: Performance – 50; Set & Costume – 30; Overall Effect – 20; **TOTAL – 100**

No staple guns allowed. **MATERIALS**: Competitors will be supplied with the following: A plank of FSC wood 15cm x 1.4m long x 1.5- 1.8cm thick and not pressure treated

Competitors shall bring their own nails. **SCORING:** Quality of workmanship, structural soundness and design -60; Team work -10; Safe working -10; Originality -10; Fit for purpose -10; **TOTAL** -100

Chainsaws will not be allowed. Only battery powered drills will be allowed no other battery-operated tools are allowed. No blade attachments on the drill are allowed. Screws and\or bolts may be used but these must be supplied by the competitors. No nail guns allowed. No staple guns allowed. **MATERIALS**: Competitors will be supplied with the materials with the following: 2no 3.6 metres of 90mm x 38mm; 8no 2.4 metres of 90mm x 38mm; 4no 2.4 metres of 140mm x 38mm; All wood to be Tanalised CLS. Competitors shall bring their own nails and other fasteners such as hinges. No other materials will be allowed. **SCORING**: Quality of workmanship, structural soundness and design – 60; Teamwork – 10; Safe working – 10; Originality – 10; Fit for purpose – 10; **TOTAL - 100**

The judge will ask one question to each team. **TIME**: A minimum of 2 minutes and maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed to complete the task, not to include the question and answer. **TIME PENALTIES:** Up to 15 seconds overtime or undertime – 2 penalty marks; up to 30 seconds over or under time – 5 penalty marks, and a further 5 penalty marks will be deducted for every 15 seconds thereafter. **SCALE OF MARKS**: Research and Concept – 30; Presentation – 40; Originality – 20; Judge's Question – 10; **TOTAL - 100**

11. SENIOR GENERATION GAME

(WHITE COATS TO BE WORN)

THEME: Emergency Services **TEAM**: Two members (between 18 and 28 years of age on the 1st of September 2023) **TASK**: Competitors will be required, individually or as a team, to complete / perform a task on the stage in a given amount of time as demonstrated by the judge on the day. **NOTES:** YFC will supply all equipment. **SCORING: Total Marks - 100.**

12. COOKERY (WHITE COATS TO BE WORN)

ELIGIBILITY: Teams to consist of three members, one must be 28 years of age or under, one must be 21 years of age or under and one must be 16 years of age or under, on 1st of September 2023. PROCEDURE: Each team will be required to prepare a three-course meal for a Seasonal Event e.g. Special Birthday, Christmas, Harvest Supper etc. Teams must promote local produce within their displays. The menu must include three courses, one starter, one main and one dessert. Each course will be required to serve two people. A drink does not count as a course and will not be scored. Teams must ensure each course involves a cooked element, prepared from raw ingredients, demonstrating cookery skills. (It is advised that the combination of smoked salmon and cream cheese is not included). 3 mystery ingredients will be provided to each team, which must be incorporated into the menu. The mystery ingredients can be used in either of the courses or all in one course. Competitors are allowed to bring their own recipe/ cookery books with them for reference (the use of mobile phones will not be permitted). TIMING: Teams will be given 1 hour to create their dishes which includes preparation and tidying of the site and to finish their exhibit. Teams will be allocated an extra 10 minutes at the start of the competition to discuss the mystery ingredients. Competitors will be penalised at the rate of one mark per minute or part thereof over allotted time. Teams will be allocated their workspace and display space. Display bays may be set up before the one-hour preparation and cooking time and teams may unpack their equipment and ingredients onto the worktable before the one-hour practical session. At the end of the one-hour preparation and cooking time, teams should have tided the site leaving a clear (wiped) worktable with only the gas stoves on it – i.e. they should have packed away their equipment and wiped down the worktable. The gas stoves should be left on the worktable to cool before being packed away. Teams will be required to: Work on two trestle tables. This includes an area to prepare and an area to work with two (2) butane gas stoves (gas stoves provided by teams). Cook and display their exhibit within the one-hour time limit. Have recipe details available throughout the practical session for judge's inspection. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges or Stewards. No other person, other than their team members, will be allowed in the competing area. Teams will not have access to electric and no access to water. Teams may not use liquid nitrogen. EQUIPMENT: Competing teams are required to provide: All ingredients (these may be brought to the competition already weighed out and vegetables ready washed -all other work must be executed on site in the practical session). Two butane gas stoves. The stoves must be like the images below and fuelled by butane cartridges:





DISPLAYS: Competitors will be allowed a maximum display space of 90cm (width) x 60cm (depth) x height optional (i.e. no height limit) which to display the courses to their best advantage. Please note these are the EXTERNAL dimensions. If teams use back and/or side boards the whole of the board must be within the dimensions given. Any accessories or drapes used on the outside walls must be included in the overall size limit of the exhibit. Displays which exceed the above dimensions will be disqualified. Teams Must: Display a menu card, Display details of recipes. There are no limitations on the contents of the display. Menu cards, recipes, and display accessories (non-food items) etc may be brought to the competition ready prepared. Displays must remain in position throughout the day of the competition. All displays and competitors' property will be at the risk of the competitor and YFC cannot accept liability for any loss of damage sustained – therefore, competitors are advised to use items of little established value. A club name will provide for each display. SCALE OF MARKS: Practical cookery skills, including teamwork – 40; Taste – 40; Incorporation of 3 mystery ingredients into menu – 20; Finished courses, suitability, choice of menu and variety – 20; Overall display and interpretation of theme – 20; Suitable clothing (white coats, headwear, shoes etc) – 10; Total Marks – 150.

(WHITE COATS TO BE WORN)

A member 16 years of age or under on the 1st of September 2023, will have one hour to individually create a piece as described in the following Floral Art Schedule: Exhibit title - "Table Decoration" Centre Piece - should be viewed from all angles to the theme Christmas. The maximum display area for each competitor MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibit to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories. Exhibit is to be viewed from all sides. Backboards are not required. If baseboards are used, they must be within the size stated as above. The exhibit will be displayed on a table with white table covering. DISPLAY: A worktable will be provided close to the display area - approx half a trestle table to be allocated per competitor. Each exhibit will be displayed to their best advantage with the space allocation. All exhibits must be the unaided work of the competitors and must be assembled on the day. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges or Stewards, under penalty of instant disqualification. No other person, other than the competitors will be allowed in the competing area. A Club label will be provided for each display. Competitors may use a battery- operated glue gun or any other form of adhesive. There will be no mains power supply available. Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified. The measurement will be from the outside edges of the base board (i.e. the thickness of the backboard will be included in the size restrictions). Any accessories or drapes used on the outside of the back board will be included in the overall measurement of the exhibit and should be within the size restrictions. The external side of the back board will be taken into account for the attractiveness of the exhibit marks and so should be covered to compliment the overall exhibit. ALL EXHIBITS WILL BE JUDGED STRICTLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NAFAS COMPETITIONS MANUAL 2023. A "Competitions Manual" is available from www.nafas.org.uk to visit the NAFAS on-line shop.

NAFAS Definitions (The National Association of Flower Arranging Societies of Great Britain) From the NAFAS Competitions Manual (Fourth Edition 2023.)

An EXHIBIT:

- Is composed of natural plant material in all its forms, contained within a space as specified in a show schedule.
- Accessories need to go in front of backgrounds, bases, containers, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics may always be included in an exhibit, unless otherwise stated.
- More than one placement may always be included, unless otherwise stated.
- In all exhibits natural plant material must predominate. Plant material must now predominate in all Still Life Exhibits.

NATURAL PLANT MATERIAL:

- Natural plant material is any vegetable matter.
- It includes fresh, dried, garden, wild, foliage, fungi, vegetables and seaweed or made-up plant material.
- It is acceptable to enhance plant material by the application of oil, milk, wax, leaf shine or other similar products.

ARTIFICIAL PLANT MATERIAL

- Artificial plant material is realistic or fantasy plant-forms, made wholly or partly from non-plant material. This includes, clay, glass, metal, plastic, plaster, polyester, shells, silk, wax, etc. This also includes fabric and ribbon made from a non-plant source, which is used as a substitute for natural plant material in an exhibit.
- Artificial plant material **is not allowed** unless specifically permitted in a show schedule (see reasons for disqualification).
- Artificial plant material or artificial plant forms that are an integral part of a container, base, background, or accessory are permitted.
- Artificial grass turf must not be used for any purpose including bases.

An ACCESSORY

- Anything other than natural plant material in an exhibit, such as, feather, shells, stones, wax candles
- The following are not accessories and may also be used unless prohibited by the show schedule: backgrounds, bases, containers holding plant material, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics. These may be decorated in any way, but greater credit should be given for use of natural plant material where appropriate.

REASONS FOR DISQUALIFICATION

- Failure to comply with any specific requirements of a class as stated in a show schedule, i.e. the measurements or the components. (Just remember it is better to aim to be at least several cms smaller than the size allowed as the size stated is the MAXIMUM size).
- Inclusion of artificial plant material (unless specifically allowed by a show schedule).
- Inclusion of fresh plant material that does not have roots or the cut ends of stems in water to water retaining material. Exceptions: Air Plants, Cacti, Fruits, Grass Turf, Lichen, Moss, Succulents, Vegetables, and long-lasting plant material which will remain turgid for the duration of a show. (Definition of turgid – the state of firmness of plant tissue resulting from adequate moisture, causing the plant cells to be fully expanded).

NOT ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE DISQUALIFICATION: the term used when an exhibit does not comply with the requirements of the schedule – see NAFAS reasons for disqualification above. The judge will write 'Not according to schedule' and the reason.

9. FLORAL UNDER 21

(WHITE COATS TO BE WORN)

A member 21 years of age or under on the 1st of September 2023, will have one hour to individually create a piece as described in the following Floral Art Schedule: Exhibit title - "Door Wreath" a Front Facing Exhibit to the theme Christmas. The maximum display area for each competitor MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards MUST complement the theme and be neat and tidy. For Clarification At the NFYFC Finals competitors are allowed to bring their wreath ring already constructed - no decoration to be added before the competition commences. The wreath will be judged on the decoration and not the construction. Each Exhibit must be suitable to be hung freely from a hook/bar. Competitors must ensure that the size and weight of their exhibit is practical to be used as a door display. At the NFYFC Finals, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white covering. If competitors wish to display their exhibits hung, they must provide their own structure to be placed on the table. Exhibits to be composed of natural material, with or without accessories. Exhibits to be viewed from the front. NFYFC will follow the NAFAS Rules on the day of the Finals – i.e. that this class is foam free and alternatives such as eco-friendly or non-biodegradable foam must not be used. **DISPLAY**: A worktable will be provided close to the display area - approx. half a trestle table to be allocated per competitor. Each exhibit will be displayed to their best advantage with the space allocation. All exhibits must be

the unaided work of the competitors and must be assembled on the day. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges or Stewards, under penalty of instant disqualification. No other person, other than the competitors will be allowed in the competing area. A Club label will be provided for each display. Competitors may use a battery- operated glue gun or any other form of adhesive. There will be no mains power supply available. Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified. The measurement will be from the outside edges of the base board (i.e. the thickness of the backboard will be included in the size restrictions). 10. FLORAL UNDER 28 (WHITE COATS TO BE WORN)

A member 28 years of age or under on the 1st of September 2023, will have one hour to individually create a piece as described in the following Floral Art Schedule: Exhibit title - "Bouquet" viewed from all angles to the theme Christmas. The maximum display area for each competitor MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories. Exhibit is to be viewed from all sides no backboards allowed. The exhibit will be displayed on a table with white table covering. For Clarification: Each exhibit must be suitable to stand freely with stems and binding clearly visible. Exhibits must be displayed in water – using a suitable water container. Marks will be awarded on a spiralling technique as part of the technical mark. DISPLAY: A worktable will be provided close to the display area approx. half a trestle table to be allocated per competitor. Each exhibit will be displayed to their best advantage with the space allocation. All exhibits must be the unaided work of the competitors and must be assembled on the day. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges or Stewards, under penalty of instant disqualification. No other person, other than the competitors will be allowed in the competing area. A Club label will be provided for each display. Competitors may use a battery - operated glue gun or any other form of adhesive. There will be no mains power supply available. Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified. 21. SILLY SENSES

(WHITE COATS TO BE WORN)

Member 14 years of age or under on 1st September 2023, to use their sense of smell, taste and touch to identify certain items (maximum of 10) whilst blindfolded. **Please Note:** Competitors must state any allergies when submitting entries to the YFC Office. Competitors to compete at their own risk. Another round will be held if there are joint placings in the top three. **Total – 100 Marks**

(3 Entries allowed per Club)

SPECIAL COMPETITIONS

1. MAIN RING

Team of up to 11 members including one compere, 28 years of age or under on the 1st September 2023. All members of the team to take part in a display with the theme, the Emergency Services. One member of the team, the compare, will commentate on the display. There will be one handheld microphone available. Competitors to provide their own mp3 but PA equipment will be provided, all Mp3's to be submitted to the YFC Office by 4pm on Friday 24th May 2024. Time: The display should be no longer than 5 minutes. Penalties: Up to 15 seconds overtime/undertime – 2 penalty marks; Up to 30 seconds overtime/undertime – 5 penalty marks; a further 5 penalty marks will be deducted for every 15 seconds thereafter. Marking system: Performance – 30; Originality – 20; Costumes – 10; Commentary – 20; Overall Effect – 20; Total – 100 Marks.

OPEN COMPETITIONS

2. MEN'S TOW

TEAM: A team shall consist of eight pulling members. No more than two (2) members of a team shall be between the ages of 15 and over, and under 17 years on 1 September 2023 and the remainder of the team MUST be between 17 years and over, and 28 years of age or under on 1 September 2023. All competitors must be full members of a Club affiliated to NFYFC. You cannot compete for more than one club and county in one membership year. **COACHES** AND TRAINERS: Only one Coach is permitted with each team during pulling. Only one Trainer or "Water Carrier" is permitted with each team. During pulling the Trainer shall take up position well clear of both teams and is not permitted to address any remark to them during actual pulling. Neither the Coach nor Trainer need comply with other rules of eligibility. WEIGHING IN PROCEDURE: Men's Weight – 680kg. The competitors will be stamped or marked on a limb in a position easily seen by the Judge, but not easily erased by the rope or competitors clothing. SUBSTITUTION: After a team has pulled the first end of the first match, the team is able to use a substitution. A substitute may replace any one puller for the remainder of the competition (Age restriction of team still applies). Substitution may be used for tactical reasons or due to injury. Any potential substitutes must (unless otherwise instructed by competition organisers) have been signed in and had their membership card checked prior to pulling in the competition. At the time of substitution; both, the puller to be replaced and the substitute, must report in full pulling outfit, (shirts, shorts, stockings and footwear) to the Chief Judge/Chief Steward who may designate an official to deal with the substitutes. A small (bathroom type) scale must be available at the pulling area, (in a suitable place, on solid surface), to determine the weight difference between the two pullers. The substitute puller must be of equal weight or less than the puller he/she replaces. Directly after the change, the Chief Judge or designated official shall cancel the stamp or marking of the replaced puller, and indicate a similar marking on the substitute, with an indelible marker. This change shall then be recorded. DRESS AT WEIGH-IN: Male teams may weigh-in in proper sized non-transparent shorts only. Boots need not be carried or worn on the scale during weighin. NOTES The 2024 NFYFC Tug-of-War Rules shall apply as set by the ToWA. Members to wear the same colour shirt / jerseys. Designated coaches to wear bibs supplied by YFC. Competitors' boots or shoes must not be 'faked' in any way, i.e. the sole, heel and side of the heel shall be perfectly flush. No metal toecaps or metal toe plates are permitted. Metal heel tips that are flush on the side and the bottom of the heel are permitted. The judge(s) has / have the power and responsibility to disqualify a team or teams after a caution or disqualify without caution for any offence against the rules. Both sections will be run on a league basis if time allows otherwise, they will be run on a knockout basis

3. WOMEN'S TOW

TEAM: A team shall consist of eight pulling members. No more than two (2) members of a team shall be between the ages of 15 and over, and under 17 years on 1 September 2023 and the remainder of the team MUST be between 17 years and over, and 28 years of age or under on 1 September 2023. All competitors must be full members of a Club based in Wales and affiliated to Wales YFC or NFYFC. You cannot compete for more than one club and county in one membership year. **COACHES AND TRAINERS:** Only one Coach is permitted with each team during pulling. Only one Trainer or "Water Carrier" is permitted with each team. During pulling the Trainer shall take up position well clear of both teams and is not permitted to address any remark to them during actual pulling. Neither the Coach nor Trainer need comply with other rules of eligibility. WEIGHING IN PROCEDURE: Ladies Weight – 560kg. The competitors will be stamped or marked on a limb in a position easily seen by the Judge, but not easily erased by the rope or competitors clothing. SUBSTITUTION: After a team has pulled the first end of the first match, the team is able to use a substitution. A substitute may replace any one puller for the remainder of the competition (Age restriction of team still applies). Substitution may be used for tactical reasons or due to injury. Any potential substitutes must (unless otherwise instructed by competition organisers) have been signed in and had their membership card checked prior to pulling in the competition. At the time of substitution; both, the puller to be replaced and the substitute, must report in full pulling outfit, (shirts, shorts, stockings and footwear) to the Chief Judge/Chief Steward who may designate an official to deal with the substitutes. A small (bathroom type) scale must be available at the pulling area, (in a suitable place, on solid surface), to determine the weight difference between the two pullers. The substitute puller must be of equal weight or less than the puller he/she replaces. Directly after the change, the Chief Judge or designated official

The judge(s) has / have the power and responsibility to disqualify a team or teams after a caution or disqualify without caution for any offence against the rules. Both sections will be run on a league basis if time allows otherwise, they will be run on a knockout basis.

(No restriction on number of entries allowed per Club) (For Royal Welsh Show 22nd – 25th July 2024)

4. JUNIOR TOW

TEAM: A team shall consist of between 7 and 10 pulling members, male or female, who must be between 12 years and 17 years of age on the 1st of September 2023. This means competitors MUST have attained their 12th birthday on the 1st of September 2023 and may be 18 on the day of the competition. DRESS AT WEIGH IN: Males - may weigh-in in proper sized non-transparent shorts only. Female – may weigh-in in proper sized non transparent shorts and shirts or suitable sports tops only. Boots need not be carried or worn on the scale during weigh in. NOTES: The 2024 NFYFC tug-of-War rules shall apply as set by the TOWA. The members of the team will be weighed as one and will not exceed: - 560kg GENSB Rules. 'Lining up women in the team will give a bonus of 10kg for each on the weight allowance, limited to a maximum team weight of 600kg'. Members to wear the same colour shirt/jerseys. Competitors' boots or shoes must not be 'faked' in any way, i.e. the sole, heel and side of the heel shall be perfectly flush. No metal toecaps or metal toe plates are permitted. Metal heel tips that are flush on the side and the bottom of the heel are permitted. The Judge(s) has/have the power and responsibility to disqualify a team or teams after a caution or disqualify without caution for any offence against the rules. COACHES AND TRAINERS: Only one Coach is permitted with each team during pulling, who will be asked to wear a bib provided by YFC. Only one Trainer or "Water Carrier" is permitted with each team. During pulling the Trainer shall take up position well clear of both teams and is not permitted to address any remark to them during the actual pulling.
