Members to be 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. <u>Total - 100 Marks</u>. [Please note that this is a compulsory competition for all Clubs]. (Closing Date for entries - 12.00 Noon Friday 24th April 2020).

2. CLUB REPORT FOR BRECKNOCK BEACON 2020.

Club Reports must contain a minimum of 250 words and under a maximum of **500** words, covering the period from April 2019 to the end of March 2020. [Please note that Club Officers listed will not be included in the number of words]. Please submit 3 photographs if possible which will be included, as this will add interest to your report and the Year Book, no marks to be awarded for this. Members to be 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. <u>Total - 100 Marks. [Please</u> note that this is a compulsory competition for all Clubs as the reports are needed for the Brecknock Beacon]. (Closing Date for entries - 12.00 Noon Friday 3rd April 2020).

3. SCRAPBOOK.

Club Members 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 to compile a Club Scrapbook to depict a club's year, to incorporate press cuttings, photographs, work within the Community etc. It is emphasised that Club information is displayed throughout. Half a trestle table will be available for the displaying of the Scrapbook on the day. Marking System:- Cover Design - 20; Content - 80; Total - 100 Marks. (Closing Date for entries - 12.00 Noon Friday 15th May 2020).

4. RALLY 2020 POSTER.

Member 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 to design an A4 Poster in any medium advertising the Rally. The poster must contain the words: Brecknock YFC Rally and Dance, Saturday 6th June 2020, Erwood Hall Fields, Erwood, LD2 3EZ; Hosted by Erwood YFC; Sponsor: Hay & Brecon Farmers. <u>Total - 100 Marks.</u> (The winning entry will be used to promote the 2020 Rally). (Closing Date for entries - 3.00pm Monday 23rd March 2020).

(No restriction on number of entries allowed per Club)

5. PROMOTIONAL SIGN.

Each Club to build and erect a sign to promote the Rally and Dance 2020. A new sign is to be made every year with the Wales YFC Theme of 'Book Club' to be used this year. The sign is to be erected within the area of the Club no later than <u>12.00 Noon Sunday 26th April 2020</u>. Clubs to upload a photograph of their erected sign on to the Brecknock YFC Facebook Page as proof that it has been erected by the correct time.

- a) The sign must contain the words: Brecknock YFC Rally & Dance; Erwood Hall Fields, Erwood, LD2 3EZ; Saturday 6th June.
- b) The sign must also include the Hay & Brecon Farmers Logo (these logos have previously been provided) which then can be fixed to the main Promotional Sign. <u>Please note: the Hay & Brecon Logo Sign is not included in the measurements of the sign.</u>
- c) The sign must be made of weatherproof material.
- d) The size of the sign must be no less than 1 metre by 1 metre and no more than 3 metres by 3 metres.
- e) The sign is to be erected in a prominent position but shall not be placed on a highway or a roadside verge.

6. FARM/PLACE NAME SIGN.

Member 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 to make a sign beforehand. Not previously judged to be brought to the Rally and displayed on a post. It should be weatherproof and readable at a distance. Members must be available to answer questions from the judges on the day. Total -100 Marks.

(No restriction on number of entries allowed per Club)

7. JERSEY CATTLE STOCKJUDGING.

(WHITE COATS TO BE WORN) Team of 2 members, one 26 years of age or under and one 18 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 to place one ring of four cattle. Cattle to be judged on breed points. Timing: 15 minutes allowed for inspection and handling. Reasons: Each competitor will be allowed two minutes to state his/her reasons. Competitors who exceed this time limit will incur penalties at a rate of two marks for each 15 seconds or part thereof. The marks will be deducted from the competitor's total.

(No restriction on number of entries allowed per Club) (For Roval Welsh Show 20th - 23rd July 2020)

8. WELSH PIG STOCKJUDGING.

Team of 2 members, one 26 years of age or under and one 18 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 to place one ring of four pigs. Pigs to be judged on breed points. Timing: 15 minutes allowed for inspection and handling of the pigs. Reasons: Each competitor will be allowed two minutes to state his/her reasons. Competitors who exceed this time limit will incur penalties at a rate of two marks for each 15 seconds or part thereof. The marks will be deducted from the competitor's total.

(No restriction on number of entries allowed per Club) (For Royal Welsh Show 20th - 23rd July 2020)

9. CREATE AND ILLUSTRATE A CHILDREN'S BOOK.

Team of 2 members, 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 will be required to write an original story suitable for children aged 4 - 6 years old to include illustration using any medium. Maximum of 15 pages per book. Competitors to bring their entries on the day and member(s) must be available to answer questions and discuss the book with the judge. **Measurements:** Display space - 60cm wide x 60cm deep x unlimited height. Measurements are to include whole exhibit. Time: 30 minutes allowed to display the exhibit. Marking System: Story - 40; Illustrations - 40; Discussion with judge and answering questions - 20; Total - 100 marks.

10. PHOTOGRAPHY.

Member 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. Theme: 'Beautiful Brecknock'. 4 pictures 6 x 4 mounted.

GROUP A TEAM COMPETITIONS 50 POINTS

1. <u>TEXEL SHEEP JUDGING.</u>

(WHITE COATS TO BE WORN)

Team of two members, one 26 years of age or under and one 18 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 to place one ring of four sheep. Sheep to be judged on breed points. Timing: 15 minutes allowed for inspection and handling of the sheep. **Reasons**: Each competitor will be allowed two minutes to state his/her reasons. Competitors who exceed this time limit will incur penalties at a rate of two marks for each 15 seconds or part thereof. The marks will be deducted from the competitor's total.

(No restriction on number of entries allowed per Club) (For Royal Welsh Show 20th - 23rd July 2020)

2. DANCING.

Team of between 4 and 8 members, 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. The same four members must dance both dances. Additional members (up to 4) are allowed to perform in either dance. Task: 1: To perform a Street Dance 2: Teams are then to perform a contrasting style of dance. Space allowed will be 20' x 20'. Time: Maximum time allowed for each team is eight minutes. Minimum time allowed for each team is four minutes. Time Penalties: Up to 15 seconds overtime - 2 penalty marks; up to 30 seconds overtime - 5 penalty marks; and a further 5 penalty marks will be deducted for every 15 seconds thereafter. The YFC technician will be responsible for playing all CD's/mp3's. Competitors to provide their own CD's/mp3 but PA equipment will be provided. Accompaniment: Backing tracks only. Marking System: Task 1 - 50; Task 2 - 50; Total - 100 marks.

3. <u>GENERATION GAME</u>

(WHITE COATS TO BE WORN)

Team of two members 18 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. Competitors will be required, individually or as a team, to complete/perform a task in a given amount of time as demonstrated by the Judge on the day. All equipment will be supplied. <u>Total - 100 marks.</u>

4. DRESSING UP.

(WHITE COATS TO BE WORN)

Team of two members, one 18 years of age or under and one 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. Two members to dress up a Club Leader/Senior Member as a character from a book of their choice. All costumes to be made on the day and therefore no work to be undertaken beforehand (teams will be penalised if costumes have been made beforehand or if they have been hired). Teams are reminded that accessories such as wigs that have been made/purchased beforehand are therefore not permitted. **Time allowed:** 1 hour. On completion there will be a parade of models before the Judge. **Marking System:** Originality - 25; Team Work - 25; Overall Effect - 50; **Total - 100 Marks.**

<u>Please Note</u>: The person being dressed up <u>cannot</u> help the 2 competitors dressing them up in any way.

5. PROMOTE READING TO PRIMARY SCHOOL CHILDREN.

Team of between two and six members 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019, at least one member to be 18 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. Team of up to six members to stage a promotion of reading to primary school children. The team must also use promotional material in the form of posters, pamphlets etc. No powerpoint or video/DVD may be used. **Time:** the performance should be a minimum of 5 minutes and a maximum of 10 minutes including the setting and clearing of the stage. **Penalties:** up to 15 seconds overtime - 2 penalty marks; up to 30 seconds overtime - 5 penalty marks; and a further 5 penalty marks will be deducted for every 15 seconds thereafter. **Equipment:** Competitors to provide their own CD's/Minidiscs/mp3 files for which PA equipment will be provided and a Technician will be responsible for playing all CD's/Minidiscs/mp3's. **Marking System:** Performance - 50; Promotional Material - 30; Entertainment Value - 20; <u>Total - 100 Marks</u>.

(1 entry allowed per Club) (For Royal Welsh Show 20th - 23rd July 2020)

6. PROMOTE FARM SAFETY.

Team of up to six members, 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019, at least two members to be 18 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 to undertake a presentation to promote Farm Safety of your choice. Suitable items to be displayed to support the performance i.e. leaflets etc. Members will be asked a question from the Judge, for which all members must be present to answer. **Equipment:** Music is allowed and the YFC technician will be responsible for playing all CD's/mp3's. Competitors to provide their own CD's/mp3 but PA equipment will be provided. **Power point is not allowed.** A table will be provided - competitors can bring their own costumes, props etc. No display boards will be allowed. **Time:** Maximum time allowed is 10 minutes and minimum time allowed is 5 minutes including setting and the clearing of the stage, followed by 2 minutes to answer the Judges question. **Penalties:** up to 15 seconds overtime / undertime - 2 penalty marks; up to 30 seconds overtime / undertime - 5 penalty marks; a further 5 penalty marks will be deducted for every 15 seconds thereafter. **Marking System:** Presentation - 50; Knowledge - 20; Judges Question - 10; Overall Effect - 20; <u>Total - 100 marks.</u>

(1 entry allowed per Club)

7. WOODWORK.

Team of two members, 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 to make an item for a school. Time: 2 hours is allowed to complete the task. Equipment: Competitors must supply their own tools. Chainsaws will not be allowed. Only battery powered drills and impact screw drivers will be allowed, no other battery operated tools are allowed. No extra attachments on the drill are allowed. No nail guns allowed. No staple guns. The emphasis of the competition should be on the quality of workmanship in the finished item. Competitors may use a single piece of board material (that cannot be pre cut), iron-mongery, rope and paint may be used but these must be supplied by the competitor. No other accessories permitted. Materials: to be confirmed. Competitors will be required to bring their own nails and screws. Marking System: Structural soundness and design of finished product - 30; Wood Craftsmanship - 30; Originality - 10; Suitability of Item - 10; Team Work - 10; Safeworking - 10; Total - 100 marks.

8. <u>COOKERY.</u>

(WHITE COATS TO BE WORN)

Team to consist of three members, one 26 years of age or under, one 21 years of age or under and one 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. Each team will be required to prepare and display four courses for the 'Taste of Game' Dinner. Teams must promote British Game within their displays. Teams must include at least one food item of British Game in their menu as listed here: https://tasteofgame.org.uk/what-is-game/. The menu must include at least one sweet course and one savoury course. Each course will be required to serve two people. A drink does not count as a course and will not be scored. Teams must ensure each course involves a cooked element, prepared from raw ingredients, demonstrating cookery skills. (It is advised that the combination of smoked salmon and cream cheese is not included). Further information about Taste of Game can be found at https://tasteofgame.org.uk/. Teams will be required to: • work on two trestle tables. This includes an area to prepare and an area to cook with one small electric cooker (County Will Supply) • Cook and display their exhibit within the one hour time limit • Have recipe details available throughout the practical session for judge's inspection. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges or Stewards. No other person, other than their team members, will be allowed in the competing area. Teams will have access to an electrical supply for their cooker only but will NOT have access to water (Competitors to supply their own water). Teams may not use liquid nitrogen. Equipment: Teams are required to provide • all ingredients (these may be brought to the competition already weighed out and vegetables ready washed - all other work must be executed on site in the practical session); •

Displays: Competitors will be allowed a maximum display space of 90cm (width) x 60cm (depth) x height optional (i.e. no height limit) which to display the courses to their best advantage. Please note these are the EXTERNAL dimensions. If teams use back and/or side boards the whole of the board must be within the dimensions. If teams use back and/or side boards the whole of the board must be within the dimensions given. Any accessories or drapes used on the outside walls will be included in the overall size limit of the exhibit. Displays which exceed these dimensions will be penalised and automatically placed in last position. Teams must: • Display a menu card: • Display details of recipes. There are no limitations on the contents of the display. Menu cards, recipes and display accessories (non food items) etc may be brought to the competition ready prepared. Displays must remain in position throughout the day. All displays and competitor's property will be at the risk of the competitor and the Federation cannot accept liability for any loss or damage sustained - therefore, competitors are advised to use items of little established value. Scale of Marks: Practical cookery skills, including teamwork - 50; Taste -50; Finished courses, suitability, choice of menu and variety - 20; Overall display and interpretation of theme - 20; Suitable clothing (white coats, headwear, shoes etc) - 10; Total -**150 Marks. Timing:** One hour to **include** preparation and tidying of the site. Competitors will be penalised at the rate of one mark per minute or part thereof over allotted time. Display bays may be set up before the one-hour preparation and cooking time and teams may unpack their equipment and ingredients onto the work table before the one hour practical session. At the end of the one-hour preparation and cooking time, teams should have tidied the site leaving a clear (wiped) work table with only the electric cooker on it - i.e. they should have packed away their equipment and wiped down the worktable. The cookers should be left on the worktable to cool before being packed away. Competitors must wear white coats or equivalent and be thoroughly smart in their appearance. Competitors will be required to wear hairnets/beard nets or hats.

9. BLINDFOLDED OBSTACLE COURSE.

Team of two members, one 26 years of age or under and one 18 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. Both members to be dressed as a duo from a book. One member of the team to be blindfolded and directed through an obstacle course by the second team member. Time: 5 minutes will be allowed to complete the course. Time Penalties: up to 15 seconds overtime - 2 penalty marks; up to 30 seconds overtime - 5 penalty marks; and a further 5 penalty marks will be deducted for every 15 seconds thereafter. Marking System: Navigation of the Course - 70; Costumes - 30; Total - 100 Marks.

(1 entry allowed per Club) (For Royal Welsh Show 20th - 23rd July 2020)

10. PALLET RECYCLING.

Team of two members, one 21 and one 18 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. Each team will be supplied with two Pallets which they are to dismantle and make into an item of their choice in the specific time. The majority of the wood to be used in the construction. Time: 2 hours is allowed to complete the task, to include dismantling the pallet. Equipment: Competitors must supply their own tools. Chainsaws, nail guns or staple guns will not be allowed. Only battery powered drills and impact drivers will be allowed. No extra attachments on the drill are allowed. Screws and/or bolts may be used but these must be supplied by the competitors. Notes: Both team members must wear suitable protective clothing. Templates are allowed. Marking System: Design - 30; Construction - 30; Finish & Aesthetics of finished item - 30; Time Management 10; Total - 100 Marks

11. FACE PAINTING.

Team of two members, 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. One member to paint the other member's face to any theme. Teams to provide their own materials. No other accessories e.g. hats, glasses etc. No copying of images, all work must be original. No use of mobile phones or any other electronic devices, no use of books, photographs etc. Time allowed: 30 minutes. Total - 100 Marks.

12. FFERM FACTOR.

Team of two members, 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 will be required to complete two basic agricultural related tasks as a team. The tasks will be set by the judge, but could be in the form of a written task or practical task. **Timing:** Task 1 - maximum of 10 minutes; Task 2 - maximum of 10 minutes. **Marking System:** Task 1 - 50; Task 2 - 50; <u>Total - 100</u> <u>Marks.</u>

(2 entries allowed per Club)

13. <u>READY, STEADY, CREATE.</u>

Team of two members, one 26 and one 18 years of age or under on 1^{st} September 2019. Each team to carry out a task on the day as directed by the Judge. Materials will be supplied on the day but members to bring their own scissors & stanley knife. Time allowed: $\frac{1}{2}$ hour. <u>Total - 100</u> <u>Marks.</u>

(2 entries allowed per Club)

14. GROUP SINGING - 'STARS IN THEIR EYES'.

Up to six singers but no less than 2 singers 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019 to perform a song / medley emulating any group of your choice. Please refer to marking system for how marks will be allocated. Accompaniment: Backing tracks only in a CD format. Time: Maximum time allowed is 5 minutes. Time Penalties: Up to 15 seconds overtime - 2 penalty marks; and a further 5 penalty marks will be deducted for every 15 seconds thereafter. Equipment: Members to supply the appropriate CD/Mp3 files which should include backing vocals only (CD/Mp3's will be operated by the YFC Technician). Microphones: Competitors will have the choice of up to six hand held radio mics or headset radio mics. Marking System: Performance - 35; Vocal - 35; Effective imitation - 10; Costume - 10; Overall Effect - 10; Total - 100 Marks.

SPECIAL CLASS CLUB EFFORT 100 POINTS

MAIN RING DISPLAY - 'IT'S A KNOCKOUT'.

Team of up to five members, 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. All members of the team to compete in an 'It's a Knockout' competition, with all members of the team dressed as a character or characters from a book or books. One member of the team of 5 to present a live commentary prior to racing, for whom a hand held radio mic will be supplied. The commentary should describe and link the relationship between all the characters. **Timing:** Maximum time allowed for the commentary is 2 minutes. **Penalties:** Penalty marks at a rate of 2 marks per 15 seconds or part thereof will be incurred if teams go over time during commentary. **Equipment:** The PA Technician will be responsible for playing all CD's/Mp3's (no tapes are allowed). Competitors to provide their own CD's/Mp3 but PA equipment will be provided. **Marking System:** Race - 50; Costume - 25; Commentary - 25; **Total - 100 Marks.**

OPEN COMPETITIONS

YFC BOYS TUG-OF-WAR.

A team shall consist of eight pulling members. No more than two (2) members of a team shall be between the ages of 15 and 17 years on 1st September 2019, and the remainder of the team MUST be 17 years of age by 6th June 2020 to be eligible to pull. Please note this is for the Rally Only. For the Royal Welsh Show, teams shall consist of eight pulling members, no more than two (2) members of a team shall be between the ages of 15 and 17 years on 1st September 2019 and the remainder of the team MUST be between 17 years of age and 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2019. Coaches and Trainers: Only one Coach is permitted with each team during pulling. Only one Trainer or "Water-Carrier" is permitted with each team. During pulling the Trainer shall take up position well clear of both teams and is not permitted to address any remark to them during actual pulling. Neither the Coach nor Trainer need comply with other rules of eligibility. Substitution: After a team has pulled the first end of the first match, the team is able to use a substitution. A substitute may replace any one puller for the remainder of the competition (age restriction of team still applies). Substitution may be used for tactical reasons or due to injury. Any potential substitutes must (unless otherwise instructed by competition stewards) have been signed in and had their membership cards checked prior to pulling in the competition. At the time of substitution; both, the puller to be replaced and the substitute, must report in full pulling outfit, (shirts, shorts, stockings and footwear) to the Judge/ Steward who may designate an official to deal with the substitutes. A small (bathroom type) scale must be available at the pulling area, (in a suitable place, on solid surface), to determine the weight difference between the two pullers. The substitute puller must be of equal weight or less than the puller he/she replaces. Directly after the change, the Chief Judge or designated official shall cancel the stamp or marking of the replaced puller, and indicate a similar marking on the substitute, with an indelible marker. This change shall then be recorded. Dress at weigh-in: Teams may weigh in in proper sized non-transparent shorts only. Boots need not be carried or worn on the scale during weigh in. Notes: The 2019 NFYFC Tug-of-War Rules shall apply as set by the ToWA. Weight - 680kg. Competitors' boots or shoes must not be "faked" in any way, i.e. THE SOLE HEEL AND SIDE OF THE HEEL SHALL BE PERFECTLY FLUSH - THIS MEANS THE SOLES MUST BE SMOOTH. No metal toecaps or metal toe plates are permitted. Metal heel tips that are flush on the side and the bottom of the heel are permitted. The Judge(s) has/have the power and responsibility to disqualify a team or teams after a caution or disqualify without caution for any offence against the rules. (See example below). (Please note that all teams will be weighed, with the winning team representing the Federation. All members must be signed up with County before 6th June 2020 to be eligible to compete at the Wales/National Finals).

YFC GIRLS TUG-OF-WAR.


JUNIOR TUG-OF-WAR COMPETITION

A team shall consist of between 7 and 10 pulling members male or female who must be 12 years of age and over on the day of the competition and under 17 years of age on 1st September 2019. This means competitors MUST have attained their 12th birthday on the 1st of September 2019 and may be 18 on the day of the competition. Coaches and Trainers: Only one Coach is permitted with each team during pulling. Only one trainer or "Water Carrier" is permitted with each team. During pulling the "Water Carrier" shall take up position well clear of both teams and is not permitted to address any remark to them during actual pulling. Substitution: After a team has pulled the first end of the first match, the team is able to use a substitution. A substitute may replace any one puller for the remainder of the competition (age restriction of team still applies). Substitution may be used for tactical reasons or due to injury. Any potential substitutes must (unless otherwise instructed by competition stewards) have been signed in and had their membership cards checked prior to pulling in the competition. At the time of substitution; both, the puller to be replaced and the substitute, must report in full pulling outfit, (shirts, shorts, stockings and footwear) to the Judge/ Steward who may designate an official to deal with the substitutes. A small (bathroom type) scale must be available at the pulling area, (in a suitable place, on solid surface), to determine the weight difference between the two pullers. The substitute puller must be of equal weight or less than the puller he/she replaces. Directly after the change, the Chief Judge or designated official shall cancel the stamp or marking of the replaced puller, and indicate a similar marking on the substitute, with an indelible marker. This change shall then be recorded. N.B. Once weighed in, the team weight allowance cannot be improved upon through substitution i.e. increasing the number of females on the team. Any weight bonus must be removed accordingly if the number of females has decreased below the original bonus threshold of the team. E.g. Team of 5 males & 4 females = 600kg (560kg + 40kg bonus). A female puller of 70kg is substituted for a male. The male must weigh 60kg or less (both in full pulling gear) because the resultant bonus has decreased. Dress at weigh-in: Male - may weigh-in in proper sized non-transparent shorts only. Female - may weigh-in in proper sized non transparent shorts and shirts or suitable sports tops only. Boots need not be carried or worn on the scale during weigh in. Notes: The 2019 NFYFC Tug-of-War Rules shall apply as set by the TOWA. The members of the team will be weighed as one and will not exceed 560kg GENSB rules. 'Lining up women in the team will give a bonus of 10kg for each on the weight allowance, limited to a maximum team weight of 600kg'. Competitors' boots or shoes must not be "faked" in any way, i.e. THE SOLE HEEL AND SIDE OF THE HEEL SHALL BE PERFECTLY FLUSH - THIS MEANS THE SOLES MUST BE SMOOTH. No metal toecaps or metal toe plates are permitted. Metal heel tips that are flush on the side and the bottom of the heel are permitted. The Judge(s) has/have the power and responsibility to disqualify a team or teams after a caution or disgualify without caution for any offence against the rules. (See example below).
