Members to be 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2016. Total - 100 Marks. [Please note that this is a compulsory competition as the reports are needed for the Brecknock Beacon]. (Closing Date for entries - 12.00 Noon Friday 7th April 2017).

3. CLUB RECORD BOOK.

5. PROMOTIONAL SIGN.

Each Club to build and erect a sign to promote the Rally and Barn Dance 2017 - any theme allowed. The cobs supplied for the competition will be of a similar type. Timing: 15 minutes allowed for inspection and handling. Reasons: Each competitor will be allowed two minutes to state his/her reasons. Competitors who exceed this time limit will incur penalties at a rate of two marks for each 15 seconds or part thereof. The marks will be deducted from the competitor's total. Members must give 'positive' style reasons in this competition.

8. SUFFOLK SHEEP JUDGING.

No electronic devices to be used to aid the presentation. The kit can be produced for any sports team, but no physical garments to be used to aid the presentation. A mood board should accompany the information provided in the pitch. Display of Mood board: Hanging space will be available in the shed for the mood board, along with half a trestle table beneath. Size: Maximum size 2'x2'. Time: 10 minutes allowed on stage for the pitch. 5 minutes will then be allocated for any questions from the judges about the pitch. Competitors will be allowed 15 minutes after their stage presentation to display their mood board. Marking System: Standard of Pitch - 40; Presentation and content of mood board - 40; Knowledge & understanding of subject - 20; Total - 100 Marks.

Team of two members, one 18 years of age or under and one 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2016. Two members to dress up a Club Leader/Senior Member as an item associated with a sport. All costumes to be made on the day and therefore no work to be undertaken beforehand (teams will be penalised if costumes have been made beforehand or if they have been hired). Teams are reminded that accessories such as wigs that have been made/purchased beforehand are therefore not permitted. Time allowed: 1 hour. On completion there will be a parade of models before the Judge. Marking System: Originality - 25; Team Work - 25; Overall Effect - 50; Total - 100 Marks.

A head mic will be provided for the dance teacher if necessary. Size allowed will be 20' x 20'. Members may provide their own instruments or an accompaniment (additional members allowed (26 years of age and under) and one individual over 26 years of age for accompaniment). There is no restriction on the number of music pieces used. A PIANO WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE. Members to supply the appropriate CD/mp3 files which should include backing vocals only. PA equipment will be provided and a Technician will be responsible for playing all CD's/mp3's. Time: Maximum time allowed for each team is eight minutes. Minimum time allowed for each team is four minutes. Penalties: penalty marks at a rate of 2 marks per 15 seconds or part thereof will be incurred if teams go over time/under time. Marking System: Task 1 - 50; Task 2 - 50; Total - 100 marks.

Equipment: Competitors must supply their own tools, chainsaws will not be allowed. Only battery powered drills will be allowed, no other battery operated tools are allowed. No extra attachments on the drill is allowed. Screws and/or bolts may be used but these must be supplied by the competitors. No nail guns allowed. No staple guns allowed. Materials: At the Royal Welsh Show Finals, competitors will be supplied with the following materials: 6 x 3m lengths of 6" x 2" CLS Timber; 6 x 3m lengths of 4" x 2". Competitors to supply their own nails, screws and any accessories they wish to use. Marking System: Quality of workmanship, structural soundness and design - 60; Team work - 10; Safe Working - 10; Originality - 10; Fit for purpose - 10; Total - 100 marks.

8. COOKERY. Theme: 'Around The World'

(WHITE COATS TO BE WORN)

Team to consist of three members, one 26 years of age or under, one 21 years of age or under and one 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2016. Each team will be required to prepare and display three (3) courses for a home cooked dinner to the theme 'Around the World'. Teams are to prepare a meal for two young farmer's exchanges visiting Great Britain on the NFYFC Travel Programme. Competitors are required to prepare and display 3 courses from the Exchangees' home country. Exchangees will be travelling to Great Britain with one of the following programmes: Africa, Argentina, Australia, Austria, Canada, Germany, New Zealand, Northern Ireland, Norway, Scotland, Switzerland, United States of America. The menu must include at least one sweet and one savoury course. Each course will be required to serve two people. A drink does not count as a course and will not be scored. Teams will be required to: • work on two trestle tables. This includes an area to prepare and an area to cook with two (2) butane gas stoves (gas stoves provided by teams); • Cook and display their exhibit within the one hour time limit; • Have recipe details available throughout the practical session for judge's inspection. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges or Stewards and if seen to do so may be penalised. No other person, other than their team members, will be allowed in the competing area. Teams will not have access to an electrical supply but will have access to water. Equipment: Teams are required to provide

• all ingredients (these may be brought to the competition already weighed out and vegetables ready washed - all other work must be executed on site in the practical session); • two (2) butane gas stoves (currently available from approx. £10.00 from camping and outdoor retailers/Argos/Amazon). The stoves must be like the images below and be fuelled by butane cartridges:-





Displays: Competitors will be allowed a maximum display space of 90cm (width) x 60cm (depth) x height optional (i.e. no height limit) which to display the courses to their best advantage. Please note these are the EXTERNAL dimensions if teams use back and/or side boards the whole of the board must be within the dimensions if teams use back and/or side boards the whole of the board must be within the dimensions given. Any accessories or drapes used on the outside walls will be included in the overall size limit of the exhibit. The external walls will be taken into account for the overall display marks and so should be covered to compliment the overall exhibit. DISPLAYS WHICH EXCEED THESE DIMENSIONS WILL BE PENALISED AND AUTOMATICALLY PLACED IN LAST POSITION. Teams must: • Display a menu card; • Display details of recipes; • Display a description of how their exhibit fits the theme: "Around the World". There are no limitations on the contents of the display. Menu cards, recipes and display accessories (non food items) etc may be brought to the competition ready prepared. Displays must remain in position throughout the day. All displays and competitor's property will be at the risk of the competitor and the Federation cannot accept liability for any loss or damage sustained - therefore, competitors are advised to use items of little established value. Scale of Marks: Practical cookery skills, including teamwork - 50; Taste - 50; Finished courses, suitability, choice of menu and variety - 20; Overall display and interpretation of theme - 20; Suitable clothing (white coats, headwear, shoes etc) - 10; Total - 150 Marks. Timing: One hour to include preparation and tidying of the site. Competitors will be penalised at the rate of one mark per minute or part thereof over allotted time. Display bays may be set up before the one-hour preparation and cooking time and teams may unpack their equipment and ingredients onto the work table before the one hour practical session. At the end of the one hour preparation and cooking time, teams should have tidied the site leaving a clear (wiped) work table with only the gas stoves on it - i.e. they should have packed away their equipment and wiped down the worktable. The gas stoves should be left on the worktable to cool before being packed away. Competitors must wear white coats and be thoroughly smart in their appearance. Dress at weigh-in: Teams may weigh in in proper sized non-transparent shorts only. Only one coach is permitted with each team during pulling. Only one trainer or "water carrier" is permitted with each team. During pulling the trainer shall take up position well clear of both teams and is not permitted to address any remark to them during actual pulling. Boots need not be carried or worn on the scale during weigh in. Competitors' boots or shoes must not be 'faked' in any way, i.e. the sole, heel and side of the heel shall be perfectly flush - this means the soles must be smooth. No metal toecaps or metal toe plates are permitted. Metal heel tips that are flush on the side and the bottom of the heel are permitted. The Judge(s) has/have the power and responsibility to disqualify a team or teams after a caution or disqualify without caution for any offence against the rules. See example below: (Please note that all teams will be weighed, with the winning team representing the Federation).

No metal toecaps or metal toe plates are permitted. Metal heel tips that are flush on the side and the bottom of the heel are permitted. The Judge(s) has/have the power and responsibility to disqualify a team or teams after a caution or disqualify without caution for any offence against the rules.

The BISCA Rules and marking system for 2016 will apply.

4. LADIES SHEARING.

Girl member 26 years of age or under on 1st September 2016 with own Shearing Head to shear one sheep. All members must have passed either a NPTC Proficiency Test or a BWMB Blue Seal in Sheep Shearing to compete in the competition - a copy of the certificate to be shown on the day. The BISCA Rules and marking system for 2016 will apply.

5. HAND SHEARING.

The maximum display area for each competitor MUST NOT exceed 60cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories. Exhibits to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed, and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering. A work table will be provided close to the display area - approx half a trestle table to be allocated per competitor. NAFAS Definitions (The National Association of Flower Arranging Societies of Great Britain) From the NSAFAS Competitors Manual (Third Edition 2013).

An EXHIBIT:

Is composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories, contained within a space as specified in a show schedule.

Backgrounds, bases, containers, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics may always be included in an exhibit, unless otherwise stated.

More than one placement may always be included, unless otherwise stated.

In all exhibits (except still life) natural plant material must predominate.

NATURAL PLANT MATERIAL

Natural plant material is any vegetable matter

It includes fresh, dried, garden, wild, or made-up plant material.

It is acceptable to enhance plant material by the application of oil, milk, wax or other similar products.

An ACCESSORY

Anything other than natural plant material in an exhibit, such as, feathers, shapes (spheres, cones), shells, stones, wax candles

Natural plant material which has been tooled or crafted to resemble non-plant forms, e.g. birds nest, corn dolly, wooden figurine.

Accessories may be decorated in any way but greater credit should be given for the use of natural plant material where appropriate.

The following are not accessories and may also be used unless prohibited by the show schedule: backgrounds, bases, containers holding plant material, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics. These may be decorated in any way but greater credit should be given for use of natural plant material where appropriate.

REASONS FOR DISQUALIFICATION

Failure to comply with any specific requirements of a class as stated in a show schedule, i.e. the measurements or the components. (Just remember - it is better to aim to be 1xm or 1 inch smaller than the size allowed as the size stated is the MAXIMUM size).

Inclusion of artificial plant material (unless specifically allowed by a show schedule)

Inclusion of fresh plant material that does not have roots or the cut ends of stems in water or water-retaining material. Exceptions: Air Plants, Cacti, Fruits, Grass Turf, Lichen, Moss, Succulents, Vegetables and long lasting plant material which will remain turgid for the duration of a show. (Definition of turgid - the state of firmness of plant tissue resulting from adequate moisture, causing the plant cells to be fully expanded).

NOT ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE DISQUALIFICATION:-

The term used when an exhibit does not comply with the requirements of the schedule - see NAFAS reasons for disqualification above. The judge will write 'Not according to schedule' and the reason.
